IDAHO TO HOST THREE JET BOAT RIVER RACES IN 2013 RACES WILL COMPOSE THE U.S. JET RIVER RACING SERIES

The American Power Boat Association has announced Idaho will host three jet river races as part of the U.S. Jet River Racing Series for 2013 including a new whitewater jet boat race along the St. Joe River at St. Maries, Idaho.

“This is an exciting time in American jet river racing,” APBA Referee Larry Darneille said.

“We’re seeing renewed interest in Idaho for growth in the sport of jet boat river racing,” Darneille said.

The first race in the series will take place April 19-21 on the Salmon River at Riggins, Idaho for the 29th Annual Salmon River Jet Boat Races. This annual event is the longest consecutive running jet boat race in the country and is sponsored by the Salmon River Chamber of Commerce and Salmon River Jet Boat Committee. The 1st Annual Race the Joe! 2013 will debut May 17-19 on the St. Joe River along an approximate 25 miles course from St. Maries to Calder. Approximately 5,000 fans lined the St. Joe riverbank to watch the first two days of the 2012 U.S.A. World Jet Boat River Marathon Championship in April 2012. The event is sponsored by the St. Maries Chamber of Commerce, St. Maries – St. Joe River Jet Boat Club and Epic Motorsports Consulting Group, L.L.C.
